Introduction

- Still looking at Epilogue of Samuel
- David was raised to defeat the enemies of God's people, the Philistines^{253:18}
- David was not alone, but he led the kingdom for God's glory
- There was again war is a defining phrase for this passage

Four Giants

Isbi-benob killed by Abishai

- Ishbi-benob killed by Abishai when David grew weary
- Abishai was an intense guy^{2S3:34} but zealous for the kingdom
- This incident led to a 'restriction' for the king who grew weary...
- David was God's anointed and they didn't want him snuffed out 153:2

Saph killed by Sibbecai the Hushathite

• Servant of David simply commended for his work

Lahmi, brother of Goliath killed by Elhanan son of Jaare-oregim

- big guy, weapons weren't as heavy as Goliath's
- Differs from 1 Chr 20:5 where Lahmi, brother of Goliath is mentioned
- Most likely text copy error
- Scripture is absolutely infallible as originally given.

Polydactyly giant killed by Jonathan son of Shimei

He was killed for his taunts of Israel like Goliath^{1517:45-46,54}

So What?

- How does this military list help us? Paul wrote to Timothy 2 Tim 3:14-15
- We see how God's kingdom works David gets credit for others' work²²
- Everything we do as believers is credited to King Jesus
- Jesus' words Lk 22:25-30. Have you stayed beside Jesus in trials^{Lk22:28}?
- Soldiers worried David getting snuffed out would be a big problem¹⁷
- Jesus laid down his life for us He couldn't be snuffed out Peter^{Act2:22-39}
- David points us to need for God's provision for perfect prophet, priest & king which God has provided in David's greater Son, Jesus Christ!
- He, unlike David was completely obedient John 4:34;6:38
- Jesus laid down His life to redeem sinners like us John 10:17-18
- The Lord's table reminds of Christ's work 1Cor11:24-26
